


Beyond the normal infrastructure

The Metro Office District has a robust, looped technology infrastructure of citywide WiFi, state-of-the-art fiber optic system, and access to an on-site high-tier data center. The Dublin Entrepreneurial Center also is located in this neighborhood, offering free courses and training to area businesses.

High Tier data storage



Providing more than 6,000 square feet of High Tier data storage infrastructure, and supporting a fully redundant N+1 environment, **Metro Data Center** is a welcome addition to Dublin's technology sector. The City has partnered with MDC to create an environment providing a multitude of services that support business growth and integration of IT services.



More than offices

In addition to the numerous professional offices in this neighborhood, the Metro Office District also is home to five hotels and several restaurants. The city also recently invested \$1.2 million to install new LED street lighting and paved walking paths with connections to local parks.



Great spaces still available

While this business district is approximately 75% built-out, a greenfield site with I-270 frontage is available for a 90,000 SF Class A office building. The site is straight zoned for office, laboratory, research (OLR) by the City of Dublin and is ready for construction.

Highway access

Located at the interchange of Interstate 270 and US Route 33/State Route 161, the businesses in the Metro Office District have high visibility and easy access to the entire Columbus region.
